LGBTQ HISTORY IN THE US



America's first gay rights group, the Society for Human Rights, is founded in Chicago



The Stonewall Riots take place in Manhattan, initiating the first major LGBTQ rights demonstrations



The AIDS crisis begins, first classified as Gay-Related Immunodeficiency (GRID); The Reagan Administration refuses to acknowledge AIDS until 1985



Massachusetts becomes the first state to legalize same-sex marriage



The Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA), which allows states to refuse to recognize same-sex marriages, is declared unconstitutional



49 people are killed at the Pulse gay nightclub in Orlando, FL, marking the deadliest act of violence against the

LGBTQ community
